A Day in the Life at PIPS: Embracing Everyday Adventures by Amelia Maree (PYP Coordinator - Hong Kong Campus)

Welcome to an exploration of a typical day at Parkview International Pre-School (PIPS), whether at our Kowloon, Hong Kong, or LOHAS campuses. Each day at PIPS is not just about learning; it's about creating an exciting foundation for our children's educational journey. Our structured routines help children develop essential skills while presenting something new to look forward to every day. From Physical Exercise (PE) sessions and visits to our PIPS library to engaging music classes, the adventure is endless! Occasionally, we throw in a surprise outing or a special visitor, making every day extraordinary.



Morning Routine

As our students arrive, they are warmly greeted by various staff members such as our Principal, Deputy Principal or teachers. Our dedicated class teachers are ready to welcome students by the classroom door, eager to chat about their weekends and any fun activities they might have participated in. Inside, the classroom buzzes with new provocations and exciting activities tailored to spark curiosity and joy in learning.

Circle time is a highlight, whether in English or Chinese, where students proudly share their news and ideas, explore captivating new topics, and dive into lively songs. Here, they develop vital skills in phonics, mathematics, and conceptual understanding, all in a supportive and engaging environment.



Learning Through Play

As the morning unfolds, our students dive into a variety of exciting activities. The reading corners welcome exploration with new books aligned to each unit, fostering independent inquiry among friends. In our "Sharing the Planet" unit, students engage with soil and gardening tools to discover what living things need to thrive. Meanwhile, as part of the "How We Organise Ourselves" unit, they may build a mini city, exploring everyday traffic signs and their meanings. This hands-on approach to learning encourages curiosity and facilitates connections between concepts.

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Creative expression thrives in our science activities, where students investigate the implications of water pollution. They engage with thought-provoking questions like, "Is it possible to clean dirty water?" This playful exploration not only enhances academic skills but also nurtures critical thinking and a sense of responsibility. The water experiment provides a valuable opportunity for students to delve deeper into scientific inquiry and grasp the importance of caring for the environment.

Snack Time and Social Interaction

Snack time transforms into a vibrant communal experience. Here, children not only enjoy their snacks but also practice essential social skills, sharing and conversing about their choices. This encourages independence as they learn to care for their belongings and experience diversity as they discover each other's preferences and cultural backgrounds. Students choose where to sit, next to friends or sometimes with someone new, fostering a sense of community and friendship.

Physical Play

Physical play is an exhilarating part of the day! Whether racing around on bicycles, building magnificent sandcastles in the cube pit, or conquering climbing frames, our students engage in activities that boost gross motor skills. The shared environment also provides opportunities to develop social skills, as they interact with peers across different classes.



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Thematic Learning and Special Activities

At PIPS, creativity knows no bounds! Through visual arts, music, and the occasional cooking sessions, our children dive into a vibrant array of learning experiences. In visual arts, they might throw paint like Jackson Pollock, explore the world through dots in the style of Yayoi Kusama, or even participate in English drama, where they develop their confidence and acting skills. Students from Pre-Nursery to Lower and Upper Kindergarten have various opportunities to showcase those developing skills, with our annual Christmas event being just one example.



Lower and Upper Kindergarten students not only learn our school song but also prepare for graduation dances and performances, showcasing their talents in a variety of artistic forms. Each level participates in artistic expression tailored to their developmental stages, ensuring that every child has the opportunity to explore their creativity in a way that resonates with them.

In story time, we go beyond simply reading; we create an interactive and immersive experience that captures children's imaginations. Teachers engage students in lively discussions about the characters, settings, and themes, encouraging them to share their thoughts and predictions. Visual aids, such as props or illustrations, enhance understanding and make the stories come alive. This interactive storytelling not only helps develop language skills but also fosters critical thinking and emotional connections as children relate the stories to their own experiences. Through this process, we cultivate a love for literature and empower our young learners to express themselves creatively.

Reflection and Closing

As the day winds down, wrap-up time gives our young adventurers a chance to reflect on their experiences and lessons learned. Goodbyes are filled with excitement as children share their day with families, either by looking at photos on Seesaw or discussing the various activities that filled their day.

As we look ahead to our upcoming Student-Led Conference, we're thrilled for parents to join us in celebrating the delightful adventures of our everyday learning journey.
